


Illustrative Map of Botswana



Botswana Wildlife Producers Association



I am thrilled to provide the foreword for the domestic travel guide and packages for the Tourism Industry in Botswana. Botswana is endowed with a rich and diverse wildlife resource whose exploitation had been primarily non-consumptive uses in parks and reserves as well as subsistence hunting. The policy document on game ranching provided detailed directions for the development of the game ranching industry. The Wildlife Conservation and National Parks Act of 1992 provided sound legislative basis for the development of a viable game ranching industry. The Game Ranching Policy of 2002 provided framework aimed at developing a game ranching industry that would provide a commercially viable and sustainable alternative for wildlife enterprises either on its own or in mixed livestock/ game ranches. Game Farms and Ranches provide an important component that diversifies the tourism product from over dependence on the protected areas only.

Section24 of the Act authorizes any owner of the land or leaseholder or any person so authorized by the Minister and who wishes to farm game or ranch game animals, to apply to the Director and the Director may, in conformity with the land use plan, and with any other written law, grant such permission in writing. Approved and registered game ranches can apply for membership of the Botswana Wildlife Producers Association (BWPA).

WHAT TO PACK

- Clothes in khaki green, beige and neutral colours.
- Long sleeved shirts that offer protection from sun and mosquitoes.
- T-shirts.
- Shorts or light skirts.
- Warm clothes, sweaters, jackets, jeans or safari trousers for evening and cooler days.
- Comfortable walking shoes.
- Flip flops for showering.
- Swim wear.
- Binoculars and camera equipment.
- Sunscreens, sunglasses, hat, insect repellent.
- First Aid kit.

DRIVING IN PARKS AND WILDERNESS AREAS



Keep within beaten tracks: Do not drive on pans, free islands or valley floors to prevent land degradation.



Speed limits: Keep within set speed limit usually 40Km.h. You will see more wildlife if you drive slowly. Be cautious when driving over dune tops, mud puddles, water crossings and pole bridges.



Only 4x4 vehicles recommended: Drive with a 4x4 engaged at all times.



Do not drive in long grass: Due to threat of fire.



Always carry plenty of water, extra fuel, a tool kit, high light jack and puncture repair kit. These may save your life.



Stay in your vehicle or tent: Do not leave your camp if animals approach your camp. They are dangerous and must be treated with respect.

CAMPING SAFETY

Camp on designated campsites only.

Your tent must be securely closed at all times to keep snakes, insects and unwanted visitors out.

Never keep food in your tent: All food and cooking equipment must be kept in your vehicle away from hyenas, lions, jackals and baboons.

Do not throw away left over food into the bush thinking that it is 'biodegradable'. it may attract dagerous animals. Also, do not leave food out unattended.

You may have a fire in the designated place. Make sure the fire is out before you leave and please bury your ash.

Do no litter! Use litter bins where provided. Burn combustible litter. Take out what you bring in.


You should bring firewood with you.

Botswana National Museum Heritage Sites





The Department of National Museum and Monuments (DNMM) also known as Botswana National Museum exist to protect, preserve and promote Botswana's cultural and natural heritage for sustainable utilization thereof by collecting, researching, conserving and exhibiting for public education and appreciation. As part of its mandate, the National Museum has over the years developed, conserved and developed some of Botswana's unique natural and cultural sites to contribute towards the diversification of the country's tourism product. Some of these heritage sites are grouped into several clusters based on their geographical disposition for ease of access by the potential visitor, researcher and tourist. Some of the developed Heritage nodes are as follows:

Southern Region Heritage Trail



Through the Southern Region Heritage Trail, the Department of National Museum and Monuments endeavour to promote the southern part of the country as an alternative place worthy for visitor experience as compared to the more affluent delta and wildlife based tourism destinations. Over the years, visitation of some of the unique cultural and natural heritage sites found in southern Botswana has offered tourists, researchers students and religious enthusiasts an overwhelmingly complete package for the visitor. The development and promotion of some of the heritage sites found in the area is based on a growing need to diversify Botswana's tourism product.

Some of the notable heritage sites worthy of a visit in the area include the perennial water spring site of Mmamotshwane gorge in Mogonye, the mystical Baratani Hill with that beautiful Tswana folktale love story, the infamous Motsenekatse Iron Age site near Molapowabojang village. Lobatse Town offers several historic built monuments and a series of liberation heritage sites that denotes Botswana's contribution to southern African liberation struggle. Here you find the first tarred road in the country, First Radio Station, the Old Legislative Council, Fish Keitseng safe house where a number of high profile South African liberation icons such as Nelson Mandela, Govan Mbeki and others were accommodated. It is at this historic town that the DNMM in partnership with the Mozambican government has recently constructed a modern Samora Matchel museum at the Kgaboesele homestead. The Department is also in the process of completing a state of the art modern Museum at Ntsweng Bakwena historic site in Molepolole where the annual Dithubaruba cultural festival is held. On the northern part of the capital city, Gaborone lies the mystical Matsieng national monument that gives credence to Tswana mythological place of origion. Natural sites with beautiful scenic views include Poloko view point, the mythological Mmakgodumo Dam and Pelotshetlha lithops..

North East Heritage Trail



The Greater Francistown Heritage Trail covers more than 30 heritage sites that span from the Stone Age period, the Iron Age period right through the evolution of Francistown as the first mining town in the interior of southern Africa during the Mineral Revolution that shaped the history of Francistown, Botswana's second city. The Stone Age period in the area is epitomised by a litany of Stone Age site, mostly Rock Art sites found across the North East District that is adjacent to Francistown.

Some of these sites include Machokochoko Hill, Gandanyemba Rock Paintings and granaries for an Iron Age human settlement, the Ntimbale rock paintings adds a cultural tourism feel to the Ntimbale Dam tourism activities. Your journey into antiquity would not be complete if you can't visit the mystical Mantenge Well. Here this natural well with "green" water offers traditional and religious enthusiasts the sacred waters that will cleanse all their misfortune and guarantees one their heart desires. Numerous Iron Age Sites are also found in the north East District, most belonging to the Butua and Great Zimbabwe Empire. These are represented by Stone Walled Sites such as Domboshaba near Kalakamati village, Vukwi Ruins and Magapatona Ruins near Goshwe village. Also found in the area are historic sites such as Tati Training Institute which is the first modern Secondary School in Botswana as well as Nswazi Royal cemetery.

Makgadikgadi Pans Heritage Trail



The Makgadikgadi Pans region covers an expanse of land consisting one of the largest paleo lakes in the world. The Makgadikgadi pans are located in north eastern Botswana, south east of the magnificent Okavango Delta and south of the Chobe River front, both of which are the epicentres of Botswana tourism. Makgadikgadi Pans Heritage Trail consists some of the most unique and scenic cultural and natural heritage sites scattered around the landscape. Recent research by an international scholar has suggested that human origin can be traced back to this area. Some of the unique natural sites found in the area include the dramatic Boteti River, Lake Xau, and the numerous salt pans such as Ntwetwe, Sowa—and Kudiakam. The eastern salt pans are a spectacle to watch during the annual flamingo migration to the area. The area is also littered with an array of archaeological and historic sites that are a testimony of human occupation in the last 2 million years. These range from the famous Khubu island north of Mmatshumu village, Kokonje island, Mmakgama ruins, Kaitshe escarpment, Makgaba fossils and an array of tall gigantic trees such as Baines baobab, Greenes baobab and Chapman's baobab that were used as land marks during the European long distance trade into northern Botswana. The area is also blessed with a few Wildlife Managemeent areas that improves the tourism potential of the area. These include Orapa Game Park, Makgadikgadi and Nxai national park.

Chobe National Park

How to get there

From Kasane, a tar road heads west past the airport to the Chobe National Park boundary notice and leads to the Sedudu entrance gate next to the road. Apart from the Sedudu entrance gate, there is the Ngoma gate near Namibia, which can be accessed by the public road that passes for 54 kilometres through the park. Ngoma is the entrance used by visitors from Namibia and those staying in the



Chobe Enclave. The southern entrance to the park is at Mababe gate, along a route that connects with the Moremi Game Reserve. Mababe gate is some 56 kilometres south of Savute and many visitors enter at Sedudu, camp at Ihaha, and then at Savute, exit through Mababe and on through to Moremi - or the other way around.



The Moremi Game Reserve

How to get there:

Travelling north-east from Maun, firstly along a fine full width tar road to Shorobe, then on a wide gravel road, a veterinary control fence is encountered - locally known as the buffalo fence, constructed to protect the cattle industry to the south from any diseases that may be carried by wildlife. After a short distance, a left hand fork in the track is taken, travelling through wildlife country of mopane

and acacia woodland, interspersed by areas of open grassland. Low speed is essential on this route, due to the soft churning sand and the chance of viewing wildlife. Eventually, after having travelled 99 kilometres from Maun, the southern entrance gate of the Moremi Game Reserve, Maqwee, is reached

The Makgadikgadi/ Nxai Pan National Park

How to get there:

The Makgadikgadi Pans National Park is situated roughly halfway between Maun and Nata on the road between these two villages in northern Botswana. A modest looking turnoff to the park's main entrance can be found 160 kilometres east of Maun and 45 kilometres west of the small village of Gweta. From turning off the main tar road, eight kilometres of rough gravel road leads



to the park entrance gate, where entry fees are to be paid. All roads within the park are rough and in many cases very sandy, so it is essential to have a 4x4 vehicle. It is also wise to carry water and travel in tandem with a second vehicle, as, if there should be a breakdown deep within the park, it may be a long wait before any other vehicle is likely to come along to assist. A sister to the Makgadikgadi Pans National Park, and located close by, is the 2578 square kilometre Nxai Pan National Park. An unobtrusive turnoff, I 36 kilometres out from Maun on the Maun-Nata road, or 65 kilometres from Gweta turnoff if travelling from the east, leads for a further 37 kilometres over a deep sandy track to the Nxai Pan entrance gate. The sandiness of this track should not be underestimated and only 4x4 vehicles should attempt the journey, engaging 4-wheel drive before negotiating the deep sand - carrying a spade is also wise!

The Central Kalahari Game Reserve

The CKGR is located within the Kalahari desert in central Botswana.

How to get there:

There are three entry points to the reserve, through Khutse in the south, a western entrance through Xade and in the northeast through Matswere. The main entrance is through Matswere. Access to Matswere can be made via Rakops which is 55 kilometres from the check-in point at Matswere. Rakops can be accessed from either the north from Maun (via Motopi, Kumaga and Tsoe) or from the south from Mahalapye (via Serowe, Letlhakane and Mopipi).



Access to Xade to the central part of the Park is made by turning off east from the Ghanzi-Kang road about 10 kilometres south of Ghanzi where indicated by signpost. Xade is reached after following this loose sandy track for 160 kilometres, taking about three hours for the full journey from Ghanzi.

The Khutse Game Reserve

How to get there:



The route from Botswana's capital Gaborone to the Khutse Game Reserve covers some 210 kilometres of varying road conditions taking some four hours of driving time. The first 50 kilometre section is along a good national road to Molepolole, where a turn to the right is taken following the directional signs to Letlhakeng. A further 61 kilometres of good tar road brings the traveller to the

village of Letlhakeng, where the tar road ends at the traffic circle. At this circle there is a sign indicating the direction to Khutse.

The Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park

How to get there:

Access to Two Rivers, when setting out from Gaborone, is gained by traveling to the southwest on good tarred roads for some 540 kilometres to Tsabong. Tsabong has basic overnight accommodation, vehicle repair services, fuel and supplies. From Tsabong the remainder of the journey to Two Rivers



is along 310 kilometres of gravel road. Then the road heads to the north for the final 53 kilometres to Two Rivers. At present there are no reliable fuel supplies available after Tsabong, although petrol is usually available in Bokspits and petrol and diesel are available on the South African side at Twee Rivieren, where there is also a shop for food, drink and souvenirs The Mabuasehube section of the park is reached separately, either from Tsabong in the south or Tshane in the north or Kokotsha in the East. The turnoff in Tsabong is signposted "Tshane, 240 km". Soon afterwards you take the major fork to the right. The first part of the road is gravelled and then becomes a sandy track. You cannot miss the new park entrance gate, about 116 km north of Tsabong.


You can also enter the Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park through a new entrance at Kaa, on the northern boundary of the park. To get there from Kang on the Trans Kalahari Highway, take the road to Hukuntsi, and then take the road to Zutshwa. The turn-off to Zutshwa is between the buildings of Hukuntsi Wholesalers, next to the airstrip. After about 60 km you will reach Zutshwa. From Zutshwa head eastwards and after about 24 km you will find a turning to the left. From this turning proceed southwestwards for about 73 km and then turn right and continue for 5 km to Kaa.



The Delta region of the Okavango can vary in size from 15 000 square kilometres during drier periods to a staggering 22 000 square kilometres during wetter periods. Its dominant plant species are reeds, mokolwane palms, acacia, sycamore fig, sausage trees, raintrees and African mangosteen.



Major species to be seen include

Elephant, buffalo, giraffe, zebra, hippo,crocodile, rhino, red lechwe, waterbuck, reedbuck, duiker, impala, kudu, steenbok, wildebeest, hartebeest, sable, roan, tsessebe, lion, leopard, cheetah, genet, serval and caracal along with an immense variety of birds - land and water, resident and migratory, some of which are rare and endangered.














Quick Facts



The Hambukushu and San communities in the area revere Tsodilo as the sacred home of their ancestral spirits. That level of respect extends to the water holes and hills. Way back in time, their ancestors performed religious rituals to ask for assistance and for rain. They also put paintings on the rock face, the meaning and symbolism of which remain a mystery.



Tsodilo has one of the highest concentrations of rock art in the world and as such, is often referred to as the "Louvre of the Desert". Over 4500 paintings are preserves in an area of only 10km2 of the Kalahari Desert

Activity highlights at Tsodilo Hills



There are walking trails – the Rhino Trail, Lion Trail and cliff Trail, and others.





Rising abruptly, and dramatically, from the Kalahari scrub bush – the rock face turning a copper colour in the dying sun – the magnetic power of Tsodilo Hills both captivates and mystifies. There is an undeniable spiritualism about the Hills that immediately strikes the visitor.

Indeed for the people who live at the Hills – the San, the original inhabitants, and the Hambukushu who have periodically occupied the hills for the past 200 years – Tsodilo is a sacred, mystical place where ancestral spirits dwell. In earlier times, their ancestors performed religious rituals to ask for assistance, and for rain. They also put paintings on the rock face; and their meaning and symbolism remain a mystery even to today.

Exploring the three main Hills - Male, Female, and child - is a journey into antiquity. Archaeological research - ongoing for the past 30 years - estimates that Tsodilo has been inhabited for the past 100 000 years, making this one of the world's oldest historical sites. Pottery, iron, glass beads, shell beads, carved bone and stone tools date back 90 000 years. The Early iron Age Site at Tsodilo, called Divuyu, dates between 700-900AD, and reveals that Bantu people have been living at the hills for over 1000 years, probably having come from central Africa. They were cattle farmers, settled on the plateau, and traded copper jewellery from the Congo, seashells from the Atlantic, and glass beads from Asia, probably in exchange for specularite and furs. There was a great deal of interaction between different groups, and trade networks were extensive.














Quick Facts



Did you know that Central Kalahari Game Reserve is also a habitat for the Kalahari's famous Black-maned lions, as well as cheetah, springbok, gemsbok, ostrich and wildebeest? It is also the second largest wildlife game reserve in the world, located in Botswana.



The Kalahari Desert covers much of Botswana, the eastern third of Namibia and the northernmost part of the Northern Cape Province in South Africa.

Activity highlights at Kgalagadi Game Reserve



Despite the aridity of the area the Kalahari is one of the best birding areas in Botswana



Night drives provide a unique look at the nocturnal creatures of the Kalahari.

Nothing prepares you for the immensity of this reserve, nor its wild, mysterious beauty. There is the immediate impression of unending space, and having the entire reserve to yourself.

Waist-high golden grasses seem to stretch interminably, punctuated by dwarfed trees and scrub bushes. Wide and empty pans appear as vast white stretches of saucer-flat earth, meeting a soft, blue-white sky. At night the stars utterly dominate the land; their brilliance and immediacy are totally arresting.

The Central Kalahari game Reserve (CKGR) is the largest, most remotely situated reserve in Southern Africa, and the second largest wildlife reserve in the world, encompassing 52 800 sq kms. During and shortly after good summer rains, the flat grasslands of the reserve's northern reaches teem with wildlife, which gather at the best grazing areas. These include large herds of springbok and gemsbok, as well as wildebeest, hartebeest, eland and giraffe.

At other times of the year, when the animals are more sparsely distributed, the experience of travelling through truly untouched wilderness, of seemingly unending dimensions, is the draw. The landscape is dominated by silver terminalia sandveldt, Kalahari sand acacias, and Kalahari appleleaf, interspersed with grasslands, and dotted with occasional sand dunes, pans and shallow fossil river valleys.


Spread out along the banks of the Chobe River, Kasane presents an array of hotels, guest houses and campsites that accommodate all the visitors to the national park. Some are splendidly situated, with wonderful views of the river and its wildlife.

Often visitors opt to have a morning game drive and an afternoon boat cruise, with an afternoon game drive the following day, as this is the time of day when elephants are usually spotted.

Another option is a day trip to Victoria Falls, which is about 80 kilometres from Kasane. Kasane now boasts small shopping malls where all basic commodities can be purchased, and arts and crafts shops. While its main attraction is the park that lies a mere 10 kilometres away, there are nevertheless attractions in and around the town.







Quick Facts



Chobe National Park is divided into four different areas, each with distinctly unique geographical landscapes. They are as follows; the Savuti channel, Linyati wetlands, Serondella and Nogatsaa.



Before it was a national park, this area was used as trophy-hunting grounds and as a source of teak wood for the blooming timbre industry (both of which have been outlawed)



Chobe National Park has the most elephants in all of Africa and you can literally feel the ground shake as a large herd moves by

The Great Elephant Census of 2016 conducted a large study of African elephants on the continent. Of their findings, Chobe National Park had the highest concentration of elephants out of 18 other countries.

Whether arriving by air or road, the first glimpse of the river – deep and dazzling in the sandy terrain – is always breathtaking. It appears as a swathe of brilliant, peacock blue ribbon, winding its way through the tiny town of Kasane, and ensuing wilderness – the Chobe National Park.

Undoubtedly one of Africa's most beautiful rivers, the Chobe supports a diversity and concentration of wildlife unparalled anywhere else in the country.

Established in 1968, the park covers approximately 11 7 00 sq kms, encompassing floodplains, swamps and woodland. The Chobe River forms its northern boundary. There are four distinct geographical areas in the park: the Chobe Riverfront, the Ngwezumba pans, Savuté and Linyanti.

The most accessible and frequently visited of Botswana's big game country, the Chobe Riverfront is most famous for its large herds of elephants and cape Buffalo, which during the dry winter months converge upon the river to drink.

During this season, on an afternoon game drive, you may see hundreds of elephants at one time. You may be surrounded by elephants, as the main Serondella road becomes impassable and scores of family herds cross the main road to make their way to the river to drink, bathe and play.
